Finally, we are still in search of a Facilities Coordinator and hope to have someone in placed for that position before the summer.

Community: Our families have been welcomed back all year. We had our first assembly on 9/10 and then had an Honor Roll assembly after the first quarter. We will be having our 3rd Honor Assembly this Thursday March, 24. We had a grandparent Breakfast on Valentine's Day for K-3. Second grade went to the Odysea Aquarium on their field trip to tie in with their study of sea life.

Things are looking alive and well here in Mesa. Parents volunteer on a regular basis and our Library is frequented on a regular basis because we have a wonderful grandmother who volunteers her time 3 days a week. She is a retired librarian.

Problems/Challenges/Opportunities:

Covid was good to us because we were open when so many schools around us were closed. However, as soon as schools started opening back up, we also experienced withdraws like we have not had in the past. We did increase in families who had never heard of us until Covid that have fallen in love with what we do and have decided they won't be going back. Enrollment and staffing with these small numbers will always be our greatest challenge but also our greatest opportunity. In a report on the state school districts and how they faired at making bench mark our state has an average of 38% of scholars at benchmark or above.

TUSD has an average of 23% in reading as a district and 14% in Math at benchmark or above. I do not have the number for all of our schools but Leman Mesa, on our MAPs test for January this year, averaged 65% in reading and 65.5% in math, well above MUSD's average of 36% and 31%.

Future Planning:

Our goal is to have an enrollment of 300 on Aug. 3, 2022. I would like for it to be far greater and welcome that but looking at the history that is the target. Of course, the history for this school has always had its trials and the numbers are unpredictable. We want more scholars to be able to find and grow their uniqueness here at Leman Academy in Mesa. For the first time since starting

here 3 years ago tours have multiple families attending. Our Kinder Round up had the most parents ever and our Sneak Peek last week was also well represented. We hope that all of these things will get the word out and we will soon catch up with the other Leman schools.

Projected Enrollment for 2022-2023: 300-350 (we are already at 229 preregistered for next year before our summer marketing begins)

Personnel/Staff Hiring Needs:

I am currently fully staffed for next year except for a Success Coach, pending an increase in enrollment for next year. This position has been particularly difficult to fill, as many people who have applied would prefer it is a virtual position, instead of on campus with me.

Community:

We have been hosting in-person enrichments and meet-ups the entire year for families who feel comfortable meeting in person. Our teachers also have been hosting various online clubs and activities, including a cooking club, Mathletes, a book club, Teatime with Teddy (where scholars bring their favorite animals for a story time and tea), Student Council, and Yearbook, just to name a few.

We have participated in the Tucson Monster Truck Fundraiser and are receiving more Tax Credits than ever before.

Additionally, I was recognized as an Honorable Mention in <u>"Best of the Northwest, 2022."</u>

First grade participated in the Kindness project, painting fifty bells to be distributed in the community.

Future Special Events:

We will be having a Meet Up with Middle School in Phoenix at the Aquarium next week while Mrs. Bennett is in town.

Kindergarten and first grade will be having a Meet Up at the Ostrich Farm in Marana in May.

We will be having our 8th grade commencement and picnic tentatively on May 25th, pending confirmation. We will be having our 8th grade picnic the following day.

We will have end of the year gatherings and book drop offs with any available teachers there to help the last week of May as well.

Highlights:

- We implemented a new program called Nearpod in our lessons this year. This program makes lessons more interactive and engaging.
- The virtual PDs hosted by the district this year made the teachers feel valued and a part of the team. They truly appreciated this effort.

- We were able to retain many scholars from last year whose intent was to just be with us during COVID.
- Three teachers are currently working on master's degrees in education to expand their expertise in teaching and learning. They have been eager to share new programs they have learned.
- Teachers are beginning to understand and implement interventions more effectively.
- The staff are becoming more knowledgeable of best practices in the virtual setting.
- We now have stability in the office, leading to better communication with families and perspective families, as well as procedures.
- Are parents are beginning to understand the purpose of MAP and did not help as much during the winter testing. Though this may have impacted the scores negatively, we have more accurate data to work with, now.
- Our attendance minutes are better than ever before, as is attendance to our live classes.
- Families are now able to click a link to return materials when unenrolling or at the end of the school year.

Problems/Challenges/Opportunities:

- Staff turnover was big this year. We lost three teachers, an administrative assistant, and the Success Coach.
 - However, we were able to retain scholars in the classes who lost teachers by obtaining either long-term subs or teachers for those positions quickly.
- As we obtain scholars from different areas of Arizona, state testing becomes more and more of a challenge. Having the staff to travel and administer the tests is also a challenge. Traveling families are also a challenge when it comes to state testing. They may sometimes be out of state during the testing window.

Future Planning:

To compete with the larger virtual schools, we may want to consider further investment into additional technology to support scholars and make learning more engaging. I am currently working with Spencer to evaluate possible tools we can use. I have also assigned Brent the task of evaluating programs for next year.

We have expanded our market to northern Arizona and have had positive reception in that market. However, it does bring up the challenge of being able to staff appropriately for state testing. If this trend continues, it is possible we will see our enrollment continue to rise for next school year.
